The Museum School is committed to supporting the needs of students with disabilities. It is the school's policy that no otherwise qualified student be excluded from participating in any school program or activity. Every effort will be made to provide reasonable accommodations and appropriate support for qualified students with disabilities to ensure that they may achieve their academic potential.

Whether or not you have indicated through the admission process that you will need or benefit from special classroom or learning accommodations, we urge you to now identify any diagnosed, documented disability you have that may require special accommodations and the nature of accommodations that may be required. Even if you have learned to work in secondary school without reasonable accommodations, you may find that the new challenges and expectations of college-level work demand that you review your need for assistance in this new environment.

Please note that accommodations can be provided only when current, comprehensive documentation is provided from a qualified professional in the field related to the particular disability. Periodic evaluation may be necessary depending upon the nature of the disability, as determined on a case by case basis. We encourage you to attach whatever documentation and recommendations you may be able to provide at this time. If complete documentation has been forwarded to the Admissions Office please check-off on the attached "Disabilities Survey" that those materials should have been received prior to this date.

The information you provide will be maintained confidentially in the Academic Affairs Office. **Your faculty will NOT be notified of your learning differences unless YOU choose to notify them or give the Associate Dean of Academic Affairs written permission to do so.** This will be true each semester you are enrolled, and all accommodations will be arranged individually by you, with assistance from the staff members mentioned where needed.

The ultimate success of efforts at accommodation depend not only upon the school's appropriate services and resources, but also upon your maintaining active communication: giving timely notification of needs, notifying appropriate staff if problems arise, meeting deadlines, and complying with agreements.
